

Problems to Prayer

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***Nehemiah 1:1-4** The words of Nehemiah son of Hakaliah: In the month of Kislev in the twentieth year, while I was in the citadel of Susa, **2** Hanani, one of my brothers, came from Judah with some other men, and I questioned them about the Jewish remnant that had survived the exile, and also about Jerusalem. **3** They said to me, "Those who survived the exile and are back in the province are in great trouble and disgrace. The wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates have been burned with fire." **4** When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven.*

- 1. Let problems motivate us to pray
- Problem -> Burden -> Prayer -> Action
- Prayer develops our reliance on God.

***Nehemiah 1:5** Then I said: "LORD, the God of heaven, the great and awesome God, who keeps his covenant of love with those who love him and keep his commandments,*

- 2. Begin prayer by honoring God from a personal relationship

***Nehemiah 1:6-7** let your ear be attentive and your eyes open to hear the prayer your servant is praying before you day and night for your servants, the people of Israel. I confess the sins we Israelites, including myself and my father's family, have committed against you. **7** We have acted very wickedly toward you. We have not obeyed the commands, decrees and laws you gave your servant Moses.*

- 3. Persistence in prayer reveals priorities
- 4. Prayer must include humble self-examination

***2 Chronicles 7:14** if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.*

***Psalms 139:23-24** Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.*

***Nehemiah 1:8-9** "Remember the instruction you gave your servant Moses, saying, 'If you are unfaithful, I will scatter you among the nations, **9** but if you return to me and obey my commands, then even if your exiled people are at the farthest horizon, I will gather them from there and bring them to the place I have chosen as a dwelling for my Name.'*

- 5. Pray the promises of God

***Nehemiah 1:10-11** “They are your servants and your people, whom you redeemed by your great strength and your mighty hand. **11** Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of this your servant and to the prayer of your servants who delight in revering your name. Give your servant success today by granting him favor in the presence of this man.” I was cupbearer to the king.*

- 6. Pray in faith for wisdom before acting

***James 1:5-7** If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. That person should not expect to receive anything from the Lord.*

- Our worst decisions will be the result of acting without prayer and knowing God’s wisdom.
- Godly leadership starts with prayer and ends without it
